

Civic Service

Neighbourhood Plan

The advertised presentation by the Neighbourhood Planning Group in the Town Hall on the 3rd March was cancelled because of the snow, but will now take place on the next Farmers' Market Day, 7th April. If you cannot get there then you will still be able to see the presentation materials as they will be on display in the Church during the following week beginning 9th April, and you will still be able to make feedback to the Group.

The Neighbourhood Planning Group has been working hard on taking the feedback from the town and turning it into policies that will form the basis of the Neighbourhood Plan. The proposed policies will be shown on the presentation materials on display, and it is important that as many residents as possible see them as the group are committed to making sure that they are reflecting the voice of the town.

Council vacancies

Beverley Davies and Craig Walking have resigned as Town Councillors, due to other commitments.

Sedgemoor District Council has confirmed that no election has been requested, so the Council should now proceed to co-opt new councillors as soon as possible:

Annual Assembly

This meeting, to which all residents are invited, will be held in the Town Hall at 8.00pm on Monday 12th March. The Town Council, the County Councillor, the District Councillor, the Police and the School Governor will give their reports. The meeting also gives the opportunity for local organisations to update residents on their activities. Dr Dolman has been invited to make a brief presentation on Community Wellbeing.

Axbridge Museum

The Museum will re-open for the 2018 season on Friday 30th March, with an official opening ceremony on Saturday 31st March.

Bristol Water pipeline

Bristol Water has confirmed that by the end of March they will have completed the testing of the pipe, made the connections between test sections and chlorinated the section of new water main between Cheddar and Winscombe. They hope to have completed the identified work before the end of March and the reinstatement of the Townsend roundabout could be done by mid-March. The Clerk will enquire when the by-pass will be resurfaced.

Road closures

- **Meadow Street** will be closed on 19th March for 5 days whilst the footway works.
- **High Street** will be closed at a time not yet announced, to enable repairs to King John's Hunting Lodge.

Broadband provision

Numerous responses have now been received from residents following requests from the Council about satisfaction levels on broadband availability. This has now given the Council sufficient comments to enable it to go back to BT to raise these issues on behalf of residents to help progress this matter.

Axbridge Pageant

Council received a report from the Axbridge Pageant Association which is beginning the two-year period of planning and preparation towards the next production of the town's ten-yearly Axbridge Pageant. This will be performed three times over the August Bank Holiday weekend in 2020.

Over this year a number of events will be held with the aim of showing what the Pageant is, and some public meetings will be held to recruit people to serve on the management group, to take on the many backstage tasks and, most especially to join the cast of 500 who will re-enact the history of the town in The Square to audiences of 600.

The first Pageant was held in 1967 when the by-pass was opened. It was done again in 1970, and has been repeated every 10 years since, growing each time.

Town maintenance contractor

The Town Maintenance Contractor worked 20 hours during February 2018 on tasks including:

- repairing the allotment gate,
- removing litter and gully clearing in the car park
- clearing litter from the Furlong, hedge and grass verge
- tidying Back Lane and removing mud from roadway.

The contractor will be asked to repair the steps leading from the cycle path up to the viewing area, and to clean the town boundary markers.

Highways & traffic

- Council received a petition in December regarding the speed of traffic in High Street and West Street. It is hoped that Somerset Highways will attend a site meeting to establish suitable traffic calming measures to address speeding throughout the town.
- Parking Services will be asked to patrol High Street, West Street and Starrs Close during evenings to deter illegal parking.
